Inflation eased slightly last month

slightly last month

The inflation rate in Greece eased slightly in August, reaching 2.9 percent compared to 3.1 percent in July and up from 3 percent in August last year, the Hellenic Statistical Authority (ELSTAT) announced on Wednesday. This was mainly due to a drop in energy and fuel prices, while new price increases were recorded in food items and services. In particular, food prices rose for fruit (11.6%), chocolate (23.2%), and coffee (85.5%). On the other hand, the only price decreases observed were in olive oil (33.2%), fresh vegetables, potatoes, and sauces. Additionally, price increases were noted in residential rents (10.9%), clothing and footwear (7.7%), air passenger transport (18.1%), holiday packages (6.4%), and health insurance premiums (7%). Between July and August, residential rents rose by an additional 0.5%. It was also notable that

price increases were recorded across all categories of goods and services without exception.

AIA H1 figures. Passenger traffic rose in the first half of 2025 at Athens International Airport, which recorded an increase

in revenue. However, net profits are down due to increased financial expenses. According to a relevant announcement by AIA, in the first half of 2025, passenger traffic at the airport reached 15.1 million passengers, an increase of 7.6% compared to the first half of 2024. Domestic and international passengers increased by 2.2% and 9.8% respectively.

Cyprus air strike. Travelers at Cyprus' main airports should brace for delays on Thursday, as a three-hour strike is expected to affect more than 50 flights at Lamaca and Paphos airports. Hermes Airports confirmed the strike will run from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m., impacting over 15,000 passengers. Hermes said airlines are currently rescheduling affected flights and will notify passengers directly. Passengers are advised to zontact their airline, travel agent, or ground handling company to confirm the new departure or arrival time.
